## BOARD BRIEFS

**Dredging** - Total Lake Care completed the dredging of four retention ponds: Quail, Sandpiper, Hummingbird and Grebe. They removed a great deal of pine straw and pine cones in addition to pumping out sediment.

**No Weapon Signs** – A resident asked the Board to reconsider having the No Weapon signs posted on the Clubhouse door and in the recreation area. The Board did discuss the signs and we believe there is no reason any one should feel they may be threatened when they come into the Clubhouse or the recreation area. This is a small retirement community, if an individual believes it is necessary to carry a concealed weapon whenever they leave their home, we expect them to leave their weapon in their vehicle when they come to the Clubhouse or recreation area.

**Clubhouse Closed** – Reminder, the Clubhouse will be closed **Tuesday, June 14, 2022** for primary elections. If there is a need for a run off, it will also be closed on Tuesday, June 28, 2022.

**Road Patching** – The Board met with Tom Gray and Cathy McElroy to review the bids for three road maintenance projects for 2022. One project involves sealcoating four cul-de-sacs: both ends of Cottonwood; Juneberry and Cedar Ridge at the end of the 100 block. The cost for this project is \$7,076. A second project involves milling ten different areas located on Myrtle Trace Drive, Mayberry Lane, Timberline Drive, Moss Circle, and Holly Springs. The cost of this project is \$15,035.00. The third project involves milling and patching some areas between the reader (back gate) to the intersection of Myrtle Trace Drive and Cedar Ridge. The cost of this project is \$16,994.00. The Board reviewed the project specifications and approved the expenditure for each. The costs will be taken from the daily operating budget for road maintenance. The timeline for the project work to begin or completed is not known at this time.

### THANK YOU, TED

Ted Ackley, our Accounts Payable Contractor, has submitted his resignation to be effective August 1, 2022. We would like to thank Ted for his seventeen years of work and diligence while serving as our Accounts Payable Contractor.

Any Myrtle Trace homeowner interested in the Accounts Payable Contractor position is encouraged to submit an application. **Lake Banks Committee** – The committee completed a lake bank assessment and has updated the five year 2022-2027 plan for installing retaining walls, pending any unforeseen circumstances, Lake Hummingbird / Vireo will be done in 2023. This lake may take a longer than one year to complete because there are many curves along the bank line and both sides need retaining walls. We thank the members of the Lake Banks Committee for their work doing a yearly assessment of the lake banks. A BIG THANK YOU goes out to the Hardee maintenance crew. They have done a fantastic job constructing the retaining walls for the Association.

### ***BOARD ACTION TAKEN***

The Board approved the Architectural Review Committee recommendation regarding driveway paint colors. The specific revision approved is as follows:

Approved coating materials for Phases I-VIII are: Acrylic paint colors Cement Deal, Taupe (both similar to Champagne), New Concrete, Gull Gray and Pearl Gray. Brick accent color Red Rocks or Red Sandstone is approved for expansion joints or along the sides of driveways or walkways.

The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association will receive the applications of interested persons to provide, as an independent contractor, Accounts Payable services. The Accounts Payable Contractor retained shall receive, for his or her services, compensation of \$2,760.00 per year. Said amount shall be paid in equal monthly installments of \$230.00 on the first of each month.

Duties of the Accounts Payable Contractor include, but are not limited to the following:

Maintain Association financial records in a manner normally associated with generally accepted accounting principles. All records will be backed-up in a manner mutually agreed to by the Association and Accounts Payable.

The duties of Accounts Payable include, but are not limited to the following:

After obtaining the necessary signed approvals for all bills, submit prepared checks (with supporting documentation) to Board members for signature. After final approval, pay all bills in a timely manner according to the practice established by the Board of Directors.

Accounts Payable shall be alert to deaths occurring in the community and shall prepare and send a check for a memorial donation to the organization chosen by the family of the deceased Association member.

Provide Contract Administrator with monthly records.

Accounts payable shall be bonded in an amount determined by the Board of Directors.

All records are to be computerized.

Accounts Payable shall be responsible for a petty cash fund to be maintained at one hundred (\$100.00) dollars cash to effect payment or reimbursement for small purchases or deliveries.

Accounts Payable will provide orientation, training, and relevant updating relative to the responsibilities under this contract to an individual(s) designated by the Board of Directors.

Any other reasonable duties to be agreed upon by the Board of Directors for the Association and Accounts Payable.

Accounts Payable represents and acknowledges that he/she is an independent contractor and not an employee of the Association.

Accounts Payable shall provide, at his/her own expense and on his/her own premises, the necessary equipment, software and supplies for the performance of the agreed services. Check forms are provided by the Association.

The agreement can be terminated, without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice by either party.

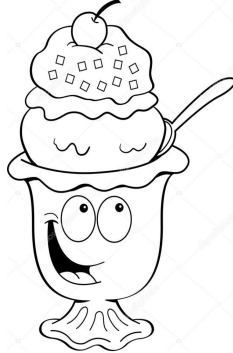

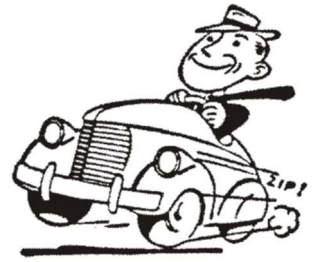
