BOARD BRIEFS

Proposed Policy – There is an existing policy on <u>residents</u> parking of trucks, RV's and campers. However, there isn't a policy dealing with **visitors** parking these types of vehicles. We, the members of the Board, believe it is important to clarify and have a specific policy so there is no misunderstanding regarding the privilege to park vehicles in the area of Pear Tree Circle. The proposed policy can be found under *Items for Board Action* in this issue of *News & Views*.

Wildlife – The clearing of a large amount of land in our area has disrupted the habitat of our wildlife. In the past few months, residents have sighted coyotes, foxes and bears in their neighborhood or own backyards. The animals will stay in our area for only a short period of time and move on when they find a place they can call home. However, we ask that you do not put any food out for them and make sure your garbage can cover is secure to discourage the animals from getting any leftovers.

County Ditch — I noticed a beaver dam in the county ditch next to my property. I notified the Storm Water Department of the situation and they sent out a representative to look at the situation. I spoke with Jonathon, a Storm Water representative, and he informed me there are several beaver dams and the one close to the hospital is quite large. He said they would have someone come out and get the beavers after which the beaver dams will be destroyed and they will then remove the dam materials and bush hog the county side of the ditch. While talking to him he said he wanted me to look at the pipe which goes under Burning Ridge Road. This pipe is compromised and I was shown pictures of the interior of the pipe. He was going to send the information to his superior and have him notify the SC Department of Transportation to make them aware of the condition of the pipe.

Temporary Closing of Burning Ridge Road – As described above, the pipe which goes under Burning Ridge Road is compromised; it is rusted and the section behind Timberline Drive is tilted upward so the water isn't able to flow through it the way it should. Actually, much of the water coming through is coming around and under the pipe. I talked with Corbin, a representative of the SC Department of Transportation (SCDOT) who came to examine the pipe. He agreed the pipe needed to be replaced and was marking the area to determine the length of pipe needed. He did not know at that time when the pipe would be replaced. Corbin called me on July 14th to give me an update. The SCDOT has asked locators to come out and mark any electrical, water or other lines which may interfere with replacing the pipe. Also, they plan to post a message board on August 1st notifying drivers that Burning Ridge Road will be closed. This message has to be posted at least a week before the closing the road. The road will be dug up, the old pipe removed and a new plastic smooth bore pipe put in place. The hole will be filled in and that section of the road repaved. At this time, the exact dates for the project or how long the road will be closed, is unknown.

Accounts Payable Position – The members of the Board and Jim Luneke interviewed four candidates for the Accounts Payable position. Each one was well qualified for the position which made the decision very difficult. At the July 20th Board meeting Cathy Smith was hired as the independent contractor for Accounts Payable. We thank the other three candidates for meeting and interviewing with the Board for the position.

Communications Chair – Ted Ackley announced his "retirement" as chair of the Communications Committee. He has served as chair since the Communications Committee was first formed in 2009. Cricket Court Sidewalk – The Board approved expenditure of \$10,160.00 to replace the portion of the sidewalk on Cricket Court which is on Common Ground. 




